They did it again

For the second year in a row CPC associates assigned to Toyota Quality Parts express (TQPE) in the Cincinnati Parts Distribution Center (PDC) walked away with top honors at the annual Kaizen Challenge. Certainly this honor is unprecedented at CPC and the Cincinnati PDC, but is rare in all of Toyota's Logistics Supply Chain.

Again tackling the problem of damages occurring during shipment, the team focused on finish and trim parts damaged during shipment from the PDC to dealerships. The team consisted of three managers, dock worker and two drivers and for the first time one of the drivers was assigned at a remote location.

Dave Mueller, on site manager, said "we would conference that driver into the meeting and have instant feedback since he would see the parts sent out the previous day. Being at a remote site he usually saw the parts after the trailer had already made a delivery and drop and hook by another driver."

Targeting a 25% drop in damage claims, the changes implemented by the team exceeded this by having a 32% drop in damages in the first month.

CPC Safety Manager Tip of the Month...... John Schlichter PREVENTING VEHICLE FIRES

Fire Prevention revolves around keeping three basic elements from coming together:

FUEL - A substance that will burn. • AIR - Oxygen is needed for combustion to occur. • HEAT - A certain temperature must be reached for a fire to spark.

4 BASIC STEPS TO HELP AVOID FIRES

KEEP YOUR CAB & ENGINE CLEAN

- Throw out trash, dispose of greasy gloves & oily rags.
- Don't leave lighters or matchbooks lying around
- Check batteries, eletrical & exhaust systems during inspections
- Have needed reapirs done immediately

TIRES/BRAKES

- Check tires & brakes before, during and after each trip
- Underinflated tires can overheat
- Be sure parking brakes are released before moving, brake evenly, don't ride the brakes.

CARGO

- Watch for smoke in or coming out of the trailer
- Know your load so you can discribe it to First Respinders
- Don't smoke when handling freight, especially if handling hazmat

FIRE EXTINGUISHERS

- Make sure its charged regularly inspected by a professional
- Know how to use it, Pull pin, stand back, aim at base, squeeze & use sweeping motion.

Canadian jurisdictions implementing "on-the-spot" violation systems.

Several Canadian jurisdictions have or plan to implement "on-the-spot" ticketing for certain workplace safety violations. The latest, Saskatchewan, implemented the policy starting in July 2014. The Saskatchewan policy allows officers to issue "summary offence tickets" for 12 offences. While most tickets will be issued to employers, contractors, or owners, the policy does allow for tickets to be issued to employees when they fail to wear provide PPE (as long as they have been trained and directed to wear it).

This is in stark contrast to U.S. occupational safety law, which only allows for employers to be fined.

Highway to Health News

Reminder it's that time of year again!

Wellness and Benefits annual enrollment opportunities are here.

Now is the time to review your address and report any changes to your CPC office
to make sure you receive all the information.

Eligible employees will have the opportunity to participate in the Wellness program and receive a credit towards their annual health insurance premium. The credit will reduce employee payroll deductions by the following amounts:

- Single coverage \$520
- Employee + spouse coverage \$780
- Employee + child(ren) coverage \$780
- Family coverage \$1,040

There are three easy steps to the Wellness program.

- Step 1: Get screened to learn your health numbers
- Step 2: Complete a Personal Health Profile
- Step 3: Take action to improve or maintain your health

The Wellness enrollment period ends October 31, 2014 or the applicable date for newly hired employees.

In addition to participating in the Wellness program, Open Enrollment provides an opportunity to make changes to your benefit plan coverage. For example, if you need to enroll, add or remove dependents, cancel coverage, Open Enrollment is the time. This is also a good time to review your entire benefits package and make any adjustments based on your current needs.

The Benefits enrollment period begins October 1, 2014 and ends on October 31, 2014

Did You Know . . . The Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration (FMCSA) has added six new violations to its Compliance, Safety, Accountability (CSA) Safety Measurement System.

- Center Bearing (carrier bearing) cracked, loose, broken missing; severity weight of 3
- Drive shaft tube cracked or twisted; severity weight of 3
- Universal joint loose, broken, missing component; severity weight of 3
- Drive shaft yoke ends cracked, loose, broken, missing; severity weight of 3
- Failing to slow down at a railroad crossing; severity weight of 5
- Operating a commercial motor vehicle while possessing a fraudulent medical certificate; severity weight of 10
