What the Commercial Driver Should Know

It's the Law-FMCSA Reg. 392.16

No driver shall operate a commercial motor vehicle...unless the driver is properly restrained by the seat belt assembly. No driver shall operate a property-carrying commercial motor vehicle...that has seat belt assemblies...for other occupants... unless all other occupants are properly restrained by such seat belt assemblies.

It Makes Sense

Safety belt use remains one of the cheapest, easiest, and most important means to protect commercial motor vehicle (CMV) drivers. Safety belts also help prevent serious damage and injury to others, because buckled drivers are better able to control their vehicles in emergencies. The majority of CMV drivers have gotten the word. A record 84% of drivers now use safety belts!

CSA & Your Seat Belt

A conviction (or Warning) for 'Failure to Use a Seat Belt While Operating a CMV' will result in a Severity Weight Rating of 7 Points on your CSA Score Card, under the Unsafe Driving BASIC. These 7 Points will be multiplied by a Time Weight of 3 for the first year, 2 for the second year, and 1 for the final year before falling off your Score Card.

Wear It Correctly

Do not slip the Shoulder Belt behind your body or under your arm. It will not protect you as it was designed. The Shoulder Belt should come over the shoulder and down across the chest. If the Slack Adjuster is used, make a fist, place it on your chest and adjust the slack to no more than the width of your clenched hand.

Focus on your safety and the safety of others by using all safety related equipment, especially your seat belt.



ANTICIPATE that the actions of other motorists may cause you to be part of an accident or incident. Be prepared by having your seat belt on at all times.

CORRECT your bad habits by wearing your seat belt, if you haven't already started. Make sure to adjust and wear it properly.

TALK to other drivers if you see them not wearing their seat belt. Remind them that the life they save may be their own.

FUN AT THE BEACH

1. Pick a sunscreen that has a sun protection factor (SPF) of 30 or higher, which blocks 97 percent of the sun's rays.

2. Use sunscreen generously and remember to reapply sun screen every two hours or after swimming. No sunscreen is completely water-proof or sweat-proof.

3. To protect your lips, use a lip balm or lipstick with a SPF of 30 or higher.

4. Protect your eyes from the sun. Make sure everyone is wearing proper eye protection.

5. Always keep plenty of water and cool drinks on hand.

TAKE A HIKE

 Start your hike early to avoid the heat of the midday sun.
Wear and reapply sunscreen as indicated on the package.
Wear proper shoes and protective gear for the terrain. Don't forget your hat and sunglasses!

4. Drink more water than usual and don't wait until you're thirsty to drink more. Muscle cramping may be an early sign of heat-related illness.

5. Keep your cell phone charged and with you. Stay on defined trails and paths. Know where ranger stations are located.

AT THE LAKE

1. Make sure an adult is present to supervise children playing in or around the water, and make sure a life preserver or other rescue equipment is easily accessible.



2. Check the depth of the water and make sure there are no under water dangers before anyone dives or jumps in.

3. Water and alcohol are a poor mix, so adults who drink to excess need to refrain from swimming, boating or use of other personal water-crafts.

4. When heading out on the water, make sure everyone aboard has a U.S. Coast Guard-approved life jacket that fits. Remember, even experienced swimmers can quickly find themselves in trouble in cold water or swiftly moving water.

DID YOU KNOW?

• **From 2004-2014**, there were an average of 3,536 fatal unintentional drownings (non-boating related) annually in the United States – about ten deaths per day. An additional 332 people died each year from drowning in boating-related incidents.

• About one in five people who die from drowning are children 14 and under. For every child who dies from drowning, another five receive emergency department care for nonfatal submersion injuries.

• Almost 213,000 people were treated each year in emergency departments for outdoor recreational injuries from 2004 to 2005. Of those injured, about 109,000 (51.5 percent) were young people between the ages of 10 and 24.

Recipe: Power granola - Serves 22

Ingredients:

- 1 cup unsalted chopped cashews
- 1 cup unsalted raw pumpkin seeds (pepitas)
- 1 cup unsalted chopped pecans
- 1 cup unsalted sunflower seeds
- 1 cup old fashioned oats
- 1/4 cup natural peanut butter
- 1/4 cup canola oil
- 1/4 cup Splenda Brown Sugar Blend

Instructions:

- Preheat oven to 300 degrees.
- Line a baking sheet with parchment paper or foil. Coat with non-stick cooking spray and set aside.
- In a bowl, combine cashews, pumpkin seeds, pecans, sunflower seeds and oats. Set aside.
- In the microwave, melt peanut butter, oil, and Splenda Brown Sugar together. Stir to combine.
- Pour peanut butter mixture over oat mixture and stir to coat.
- Spread granola in a packed, single layer onto prepared baking sheet. Bake for 40-45 minutes, stirring every 10 minutes to ensure even browning.
- Remove from oven and let cool completely.
- Break up granola and store in an air-tight container.
- MAKE IT GLUTEN-FREE: Verify that the ingredients that you are using are gluten-free and this granola can be gluten-free. Be sure you are buying gluten-free oats.
